

Patient Led Assessments of the Care Environment: Would you take part?

Good environments matter. Every NHS patient should be cared for with compassion and dignity in a clean, safe environment. Patient-led assessments of the care environment (PLACE) help us understand how well we are meeting the needs of our patients, and identify where improvements can be made. The assessments give patients and the public a voice to drive and influence the way their local health and care services are delivered.

Assessment teams are a collaboration between staff and patient assessors, with patient assessors making up at least 50 per cent of the assessment team. Anyone who uses the service can be a patient assessor, including current patients, their family and visitors, carers, patient advocates or patient council members. NHS Foundation Trust Governors can also be patient assessors.

In the Yorkshire region alone, there's approximately 3,300 people per year that will suffer an out of hospital, sudden cardiac arrest.

By performing CPR, we are giving an increase in that chance of survival. Last month we were thrilled to introduce a new CPR kiosk on the main concourse here at Bradford Royal Infirmary. This innovative kiosk offers the public a hands-on opportunity to practise CPR on a life-like manikin.

We are very proud to be the first Trust in the country to install a kiosk that can encourage everyone to learn this vital skill in CPR.

Today we will hear from Ben Mckay, Education Manager, and Eve Flockton, Resuscitation Training Lead, about the benefits of these new kiosks for both patients and staff and the crucial importance of learning CPR.

One in eight men are going to get prostate cancer, and one in five men are diagnosed with prostate cancer too late for them to be cured, but early detection plays an important role in shaping the prognosis and successful treatment outcomes.

Chidi's message is simple: if you have any symptoms, get checked; go to your GP and get a blood test – it could save your life.
